**SUBJECT:** FY 2021 Western State & Private Forestry Landscape Scale Restoration Funding

Recommendations

**DATE:** February 16, 2021

Please find enclosed recommendations for the FY 2021 Western State & Private Forestry Landscape Scale Restoration Grants. Many excellent proposals were received and the total amount requested greatly exceeded likely funds available. This year, applicants were limited to submitting a maximum of five proposals per state/island. 46 project proposals were submitted for a total request of \$12,439,007.

The Western Forestry Leadership Coalition (WFLC) membership has approved the following FY 2021 grant proposals as the recommendation for funding at the total of \$4,166,666 for the west. This would fully fund 13 projects; and partially fund two projects: Recommendation #6 at \$98,070 (NE NSA) and Recommendation #15 at \$195,347 (SE AZ Borderlands, AZ). Please note that no state can receive more than 15% of the total western allocation.

The WFLC membership has chosen to continue setting aside up to \$300,000 as a subcompetition pool for Pacific Island applications under \$200,000. Proposals from Pacific Island applicants that were under \$200,000 were scored alongside the general pool of applications, however were considered for funding separately. Pacific Island applications requesting greater than \$200,000 were not removed from the 'regular' funding selection pool. This approach resulted in the recommendation to fully fund Recommendation #29 (Marianas, MP) at \$70,000 and Recommendation #41 (Restoration, GU) at \$199,849. The total for both requests equals \$269,849, representing the total for this year's Pacific Island set aside. No other

eligible proposals from the Pacific Island applicants were received. The remaining \$30,151 not used for the Pacific Island subcompetition was returned to the general funding pool.

If more funding becomes available, we hope you will consider funding additional competitive projects from our remaining list of high quality western proposals. The tables on the following pages show 1) the list of recommended proposals sorted by rank and showing funding recommendations and funds allocated per proposal; 2) the list of recommended proposals sorted by USDA Forest Service Regions with sub-totals for funding recommendations; and 3) a copy of the web portal summary.

All proposals, comments, and scores, as well as the attached summary sheet can be found at www.forestrygrants.org. Thank you for providing notice the final total of \$4,166,666 for the FY 2021 Western Competitive Resource Allocation Grants. The recommendation list was adjusted accordingly from the initial anticipated total of \$4,000,000. - 1. Grant pool for FY2020 is estimated at \$4,166,666.
  - Forestrygrants.org System is set to \$3,896,817 to account for the Western Pacific Islands Sub-competition applications to be funded.
  - Maximum request per applicant set at \$624,999 (\$16.039% of the \$3,896,817 and 15% of the original \$4,166,666).
- 2. Denotes a multi-state proposal.
- 3. NE NSA request for funds was \$200,200, but NE hit 15% per state cap limit. Project is recommended for partial funding at \$98,070.
- 4. NE Tree Diversity proposal not recommended for funding due to NE hitting 15% per state cap limit.
- 5. \$3,896,817 total funding was exhausted after partially funding AZ: SE AZ Borderlands at \$195,347. Original request was for \$255,108.
- 6. Pacific Island Forestry Sub-competition Pool Total pool can be up to \$300,000. Projects under \$200,000 each qualify to be considered under the sub-competition.
  - Two projects, GU Restoration from Guam requesting \$199,849 and MS Marianas from the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands requesting \$70,000, totaling \$269,849 were applied for. These projects will receive full funding and \$30,151 was returned to the general competition pot of money.
